#### **BREAKTIME AND LUNCHTIME**

There is a break in the morning for 15 minutes when your child can enjoy a well-deserved rest. Break is from **10.30am to 10.45am**.

Lunchtime is in three sittings for specific Key Stages;

**12:15 to 12:45pm** for Key Stage 3, **12.45pm to 1.15pm** for Key Stage 4 and **1.15pm to 1.45pm** for Key Stage 5

We have Lunchtime Supervisors to ensure your child is looked after. Students are NOT allowed to go off premises for any reason during the day.

Staff are on lunchtime and break time duty outside to support the wellbeing of your child. Lunchtime is an important social time for students when they meet new friends and catch up with old friends. We have a supervised quiet room for those students who need this facility.

#### **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

At Queensbury School we believe that the reputation of the school and the students is enhanced by wearing school uniform. There are a number of reasons why we have school uniform at Queensbury;

#### SIXTH FORM UNIFORM

Sixth form students will no longer be required to wear school uniform on a daily basis, this is to prepare them for adulthood. We want students to be able to show that they can make appropriate choices in terms of clothing. The dress code will be smart casual.

When going out on community access and or other events students **will be** required to wear a teal coloured hoodie or polo shirt with the Queensbury Logo. Both will be available to purchase from Trutex Erdington (73 high Street).

## **MOBILE PHONES**



Mobile phones/Ipods/Ipads/tablets must NOT be switched on or used during school times



#### **Electronic Devices and Phones**

Mobile phones must NOT be switched on or used during school times. Phones, tablets, smart watches or any other portable, electronic recording device of any kind are not allowed on the school site.



## WHAT HAPPENS WHEN MY CHILD IS LATE TO SCHOOL

If a student arrives late to Registration without a valid reason a late mark will be given by their Tutor. If they arrive after the normal registration period, then the student must go to Reception and pick up a 'late' slip.



#### WHAT HAPPENS WHEN MY CHILD IS ABSENT FROM SCHOOL

Parents are requested to contact the school on the first day of absence (before 9.00am). This procedure must be followed on each day of absence.

## WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CHILD IS TAKEN ILL AT SCHOOL



Any students who feel unwell during the school day should inform their Teacher who will send the student to the office with their Teaching Assistant. Staff will assess what needs to be done. If necessary, Parents/Carers will be contacted to collect their child and, if necessary, take them for treatment. This also happens when a child suffers a minor injury.



#### **HOMEWORK**



Students will be set homework for their core subjects. Students will be mainly set homework using our learning platform called 'PurpleMash'. Their homework can be recorded in their planner which provides a record of homework set as well as other useful information. On an everyday basis, the planner is also a useful means of communicating between Teachers and Parents/Carers and vice versa as there is space available for comments/messages. A homework timetable will be provided in September.

## **AFTER SCHOOL CLUB**

We currently offer after school Art Therapy for students and in the future we hope to offer more clubs such as Midland Mencap Club.




## Our 5 Golden Rules

- 5. We look after our school and each other











#### **OUR REWARD SYSTEM**

Queensbury School has just launched a new reward system called 'Go for Green'

## Family Support Worker


Miss Cartwright is our Family Support Worker at Queensbury School. She is here to support all our students and their families.




## **SCHOOL MEALS**
