

This will go someway to helping the local authority with the pressure on SEND placements across the city. We anticipate works to start next half term, subject to planning and to be ready for students next academic year.

On Wednesday 5th October, 10V hosted the Macmillan Coffee morning for the entire school and KS3 parents.



What is the Queensbury School PTA?

Career Information

Welcome to the first careers section of this academic year. My name is Mr Mitchell and I am here to help with everything careers related. Like many schools, we use the word 'careers' but this covers everything that our students may go on to do, such as employment, volunteering and/or living as independently as possible.

Future Options

On Wednesday 12th October Queensbury school held their annual Future Options careers fair. Over 75 students attended and spoke to many different providers from mainstream colleges. specialist colleges, training providers, specialist care providers and a leading independent construction and property management company. This allowed students, parents, carers from all the MAT schools a chance to discuss vocational courses such as construction, sport, IT and games design, specialist routes such as pathways to independence or pathways to employment, bespoke care packages and the wide variety of roles connected to construction. There was lots of positivity in the room and both students and exhibitors commented on how engaged everyone was and how much information was available. It is great to know that our students really do have a wide choice for their future options. Don't worry if you missed the event, as we will be putting contact details for all the providers on our website.

Work experience

As things continue to return to normal after the Covid pandemic we are hopeful that there will be more opportunities for students to go out on work experience. Sixth form students have a day a week when they are not in school and working or volunteering on this day would be ideal. If you can offer a student a placement or would like to discuss work experience. please contact me.

Preference forms

All Year 11 students should have received their preference forms from SENAR or school. Preference forms are used to select student's destination after Year 11, even if they intend to stay at Queensbury. These need to be completed and returned to school as soon as possible please. SENAR are no longer using preference forms for Year 14 (or 12 or 13) students. Preferred destinations should be discussed and noted in EHCP meetings. Again, we are happy to help if needed.

This means students will be offered a breakfast of bagels, toast or pastries in class every morning free of charge"













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
