

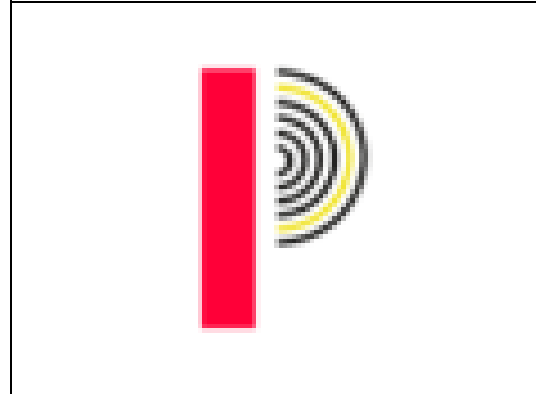

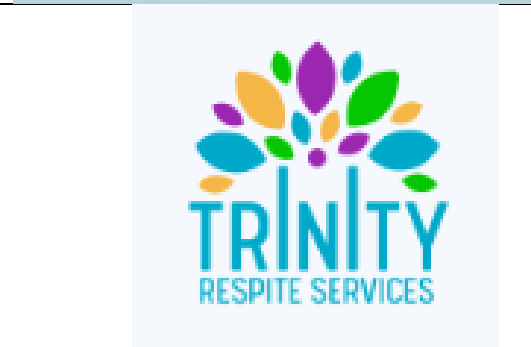

The SENAR Process (How a college or provider is named on the EHCP).

Phase 1: Preparation (Years 10 & 13)

- **First Contact:** A **careers advisor** contacts the family.
- **Student Interview:** They meet the student individually, with family, or in class.
- **Action Plan:** They create a next-steps plan matching the student's goals.
- **Research:** Families research and visit suggested colleges or training providers.

Phase 2: The Annual Review

- **Meeting Attendance:** The careers advisor attends the **EHCP annual review**.
- **Updating Goals:** They align the EHCP sections with the chosen future paths.
- **Preference Form:** Year 10 students complete a form confirming their top choices.

Phase 3: The Consultation Process

- **SENAR Review:** The local authority contacts preferred and other providers, including mainstream.
- **Needs Check:** Providers assess if they can meet needs in **Sections B and F** of the EHCP.
- **Final Selection:** A panel rejects unsuitable options and picks the most suitable match that is the most effective use of their resources.
- **Deadline:** SENAR sends the final placement decision by **31 March** in Year 11 or 14. [\[1\]](#)

Phase 4: Final Outcomes

- **Agreement:** The chosen provider contacts the family directly to start **transition planning**.
- **Disagreement:** Families hold a legal **right to appeal** if they object to the named provider.
- **Cease to Maintain:** If no placement is found, SENAR may stop the EHCP and transfer care to **Adult Social Care**. This can also be appealed.

What to look for when choosing a school, college or other provider?

When choosing an educational provider, **the final choice(s) rest(s) entirely with the student and their family**, while careers advisors like Jackie Hopkins and Andy Mitchell offer guidance. Finding the right fit involves an initial research phase followed by highly recommended in-person visits.

Here is what you need to look for, evaluate, and act upon during this process.

1. Online Research & Fairs

- **Provider List:** Review the specific options catalogued on the list curated by **Jackie and Andy**.
- **Digital Screening:** Search the providers online to review their course directories and general entry criteria.
- **Careers Fairs:** Attend school-hosted future options fairs to speak directly with visiting college representatives.

2. The In-Person Visit (Crucial Step)

- **The Atmosphere:** Assess the general "feel" of the campus to ensure the young person feels safe and comfortable.
- **Staff Interaction:** Meet the educators and support staff to evaluate if they understand and can accommodate specific needs.
- **Facilities & Courses:** Tour the physical classrooms, workshops, and recreational spaces to ensure they promote progress.

3. Practical Logistics

- **Accessibility:** Check if the physical layout matches the mobility and sensory needs of the student.
- **Daily Commute:** Map out the journey to confirm the student can realistically manage the travel time every day.
- **Transport Options:** Inquire directly if the college or local authority provides dedicated transport or travel training.

Next Steps

Once you complete your site visits and narrow down your top choices, you will **submit your final preferences to the local authority** for the consultation phase. Because this process can feel daunting, you can request ongoing assistance from the school and your MAT careers advisors.

Not sure what to ask? Here is a checklist of specific questions to ask the staff during your upcoming college open day visits.

General Environment & Support

- How many students are in a typical class?
- What is the staff-to-student ratio?
- How does the college handle sensory overload?
- Where is the designated quiet space?
- What medical or nursing staff are on-site?
- How do you manage medication administration?
- What therapy services do you provide on-site?

EHCP & Learning Delivery

- How do you deliver Section F provisions?
- Who monitors progress against EHCP outcomes?
- How often do you update parents on targets?
- What assistive technology do students use?
- Can courses be adapted for non-readers?
- Do you offer independent life skills classes?
- What qualifications or certificates can students earn?

Logistics & Transition

- Do you offer independent travel training?
- Where do local authority buses drop off?
- What does a typical transition plan look like?
- Can my child do transition visits before starting?
- What do your students do after leaving?
- How do you support the move to adulthood?
- When are your next open days?

How to apply directly to schools, colleges or other providers

When a direct application is required, you must submit it alongside the local authority EHCP consultation process. Providers handle these applications independently to assess if they can accommodate a student's needs.

Here is the step-by-step breakdown of how to apply directly, prepare for interviews, and understand offers.

1. Timing the Application

- **Varying Timelines:** Some providers require immediate applications to assess needs early, while others wait for the local authority to name them.
- **Follow Requests:** Submit a direct application immediately if requested by the local authority, your current school, or the provider.

2. Submitting the Application

- **Online Registration:** Create an account with a username and password on the college or sixth form website.
- **Required Data:** Enter personal details, current courses, and any predicted exam grades.
- **Flag the EHCP:** Explicitly state that the student has an **EHCP** and detail all additional support needs.
- **Sixth Form Variations:** Check individual sixth form websites directly, as their application pathways vary.

3. The Interview and Assessments

- **Suitability Check:** Attend the mandatory interview to ensure the student and the chosen course are a good match.
- **Practical Auditions:** Prepare for course-specific assessments, such as music auditions, art portfolios, or online Maths and English tests.
- **School References:** If requested, your current school can prepare a reference verifying the student's attendance, punctuality, and attitude to learning.
- **Ask Questions:** Use this meeting as a chance for the student to ask the interviewer prepared questions.

4. The Outcome

- **Conditional Offers:** Expect a "Conditional Offer" after a successful interview.
- **Grade Requirements:** Remember that a conditional offer means the student must still achieve specific exam grades in August to secure their September place (alternative courses may be offered).

Local Authority Transport Options

- **Free Bus Pass:** Standard public transport passes are provided if the student can travel independently.
- **Specialist Vehicles:** Dedicated taxis, minibuses, or wheelchair-accessible vehicles are arranged for students with complex needs.
- **Out-of-Area Travel:** Funding is available for colleges outside your local authority border if they are the closest suitable option.

Key Criteria for Eligibility

- **Nearest Provider:** The local authority only pays if the student attends the absolute closest school or college that can meet their needs.
- **EHCP Alignment:** The placement must be explicitly named and agreed upon by the **SENAR/SEND team** during the review process.
- **Walking Distance:** Decision-makers assess if the student can physically walk or use public transport before approving special vehicles.
- **Personal Choice Costs:** If you choose a school further away than the one recommended by the local authority, **you must pay all transport costs.**

Important Rules

- **Regular Reviews:** Help is not permanent; the local authority reviews transport needs frequently as the young person grows older and gains independence.
- **Local Policy Checks:** Specific rules, deadlines, and mileage limits vary, so you must check the "school travel" section on your specific **local authority website.**
